MoorHeart Recognition: AARP Free Income Tax Assistance Volunteer Preparers

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to recognize and honor the AARP Free Income Tax Assistance Volunteer Preparers with the MoorHeart award.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The MoorHeart award recognizes individuals and organizations that go above and beyond to demonstrate community within our City by their actions and service. A team of volunteers from City boards and commissions selects award recipients who are recognized at City Council meetings. The MoorHeart selection committee chose to recognize AARP Free Income Tax Assistance Volunteers because of their continued dedication to assisting Moorhead residents with taxes each year.

AARP's certified volunteer tax preparation services ensure that all Moorhead residents have access to assistance in navigating taxes while also providing educational resources for everyone.

Hope Their, the City of Moorhead's Senior Center Director, wrote in the nomination:

The certified IRS volunteers begin training months ahead of time. Once tax season starts, these volunteers work four days per week in Moorhead and prepare and electronically file over 1,000 income tax returns in the two and one-half month tax season. In 2024 alone, they completed 353 tax returns (242 clients were over 60 years old) at the Moorhead Senior Center and 666 tax returns (436 clients were over 60 years old) at the Moorhead Public Library. There were a total of 17 volunteers at the Moorhead sites in 2024, and 9 to 11 volunteers assisted citizens at each location site. In addition to providing tax services, some volunteers generously bring refreshments for taxpayers to enjoy while they wait. Several of the volunteers have served more than 5 years each, including Harold Vanderbush who has volunteered for 20 years.

By offering personalized guidance, this free tax services ensures that people in Moorhead and neighboring communities can maximize tax refunds and credits. The certified IRS volunteers that come together to provide this valuable service shine with MoorHeart generosity.

Thank you, AARP, for providing this exceptional service to members of our community year after year. Your work highlights the Moorhead spirit, and we thank you!

The MoorHeart award is commemorated with a piece of art commissioned from local artist, Dennis Krull especially for this purpose.

Council member White congratulated Moorhead Human Rights Commission Chair Siham Amedy on being named a YWCA Women of the Year. Council member White attended a West Central Initiative Economic Development Board meeting to discuss housing. Council member White also thanked the Concordia student body for their participation in a Meet Your Ward 3 Council Member event at Concordia College.

Council member Nelson stated the Red River Regional Dispatch Center construction project continues with plans to open bids on May 9.

Council member Hendrickson attended the FM Rotary's Recital With A Cause fundraiser and mentioned awe in the talent on display in the region.

Council member Gilbertson thanked the City of Moorhead Assessing team for its work on property valuations leading up to the Board of Appeals and Equalization meeting on April 18.

Council member Nesemeier stated West Central Initiative is hosting a 'Going Local' event to discuss activating people in rural communities. Council member Nesemeier also attended the Red River Spring Market at MSUM.

Mayor Carlson presented at the Chamber of Commerce's Women in Business event and toured Down Home, a non-profit organization that provides furniture and home decor to families moving out of homelessness. Mayor Carlson participated in story time at the Moorhead Public Library and attended the MSUM Red Flame Gala. She thanked President Downs for his inspiring message to the community. Mayor Carlson also attended a pre-meeting for the upcoming Honor Flight that transports American Veterans to Washington DC as a recognition and thank you for their service and sacrifice.

17. City Manager Reports

City Manager Mahli shared there is a tree workshop on April 22 at 6:00 at the Moorhead Public Library called Emerald Ash Borer Solutions & Smart Tree Choices. City Forester Trent Wise is a speaker. Moorhead Forestry is also hosting a tree planting event in mid-May. Information and details are being development and will be shared citywide.

Moorhead Cleanup Days are scheduled May 6 to May 17. The Clay County Resource Recovery Center is also accepting materials free of charge beginning April 29 to May 18 for residents. The Resource Recovery Center will remain open Saturday May 4 and May 18 from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm for household debris. There is no change for Moorhead and Clay County residents.

City Manager Mahli shared that as part of Minnesota GreenStep Cities, Moorhead collects sustainability data and a variety of metrics as a baseline for improvement. The data includes information on walking/biking infrastructure, transit options, food, water, renewable energy, solid waste, comprehensive planning, and more. Right now, Moorhead is the only community in the metro that is benchmarking energy use in public buildings. City Manager Mahli stated Moorhead has been notified that it will be recognized as a Step 5 GreenStep City at the League of Minnesota Cities' Annual Conference in Rochester in June.

Public Hearing to Consider Reduction in Public Transit Service Hours on MATBUS and MAT Paratransit to Become Effective July 1, 2024

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Manager are asked to conduct a public hearing and subsequently consider approval of reducing service hours on MATBUS Fixed Routes and MAT Paratransit to end at 10:15 p.m. rather than 11:15 p.m., Monday through Saturday, effective July 1, 2024 (contingent upon approval by the City of Fargo):

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The Cities of Moorhead and Fargo are considering service changes to operating hours to become effective July 1, 2024. In addition, Fargo is considering other route changes to Routes 13, 15, 32W, 33 and 36.

The MATBUS system has over the past three years enacted various temporary reductions in service hours to provide consistent, and reliable service levels in the face of a long-term driver shortage. In addition, MATBUS has seen changing ridership patterns post COVID-19, with rides dropping from 1.8 million in 2019 to 1.2 million rides in 2023. MATBUS is proposing to make a portion of the previously enacted temporary service changes permanent, allowing MATBUS to provide levels of service based on current ridership demands while addressing long-term driver shortages and a decrease in federal funding due to new allocation formulas applied to the Fargo-Moorhead urbanized area. Moorhead's ridership data for 2023 by the hour is provided on the following page.

Per Moorhead's "Fare and Service Change Policy" approved on September 10, 2018, the proposed changes meet the definition of "major change" and require a public hearing. Notices of the proposed changes, informational meetings and public hearings were published in the FM Extra and provided to passengers by posting notices at the Ground Transportation Center (GTC), posting on the MATBUS website, sending a Moorhead eNotification and a rider alert email, placing a display board at the GTC and through social media. Ridership data was displayed at the GTC, and comment sheets were available.

An open house informational meeting was held on May 6, 2024, from 4-6 pm at the GTC to gather public comments and input. As of May 7, comments were received from 17 people, of which four were related to service hours, asking not to reduce hours on Saturday or on Paratransit. After receiving public input on the proposed route/service changes, an adjustment was made to the public notice. Previously, Saturday service hours were proposed to permanently end at 8:15 p.m. This was updated to propose that Saturday service will end at 10:15 p.m. instead. This service hour change would take place when sufficient drivers are available and when Fargo can arrange for an alternative restroom location for routes using the



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West Acres hub (the mall closes at 8 p.m. on Saturdays). A summary of the comments received is attached.

Transit administrative staff will continue to temporarily suspend the following services in Moorhead until such time as sufficient drivers are consistently available to reinstate these hours (expected to be in late August 2024):

- Saturday service hours on MATBUS Fixed Routes and MAT Paratransit between 8:15 p.m. and 10:15 p.m.
- Reduced frequency from 15-minutes to 30-minutes on Route 2 during the MSUM academic year from 2:30-6:30 p.m., Monday-Friday.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The decrease in revenue hours will provide some cost savings in the 2024 Mass Transit budget. However, with the potential implementation of the Transit Reorganization Study at year-end, other expenses may occur to offset that savings.

PUBLIC COMMENTS RECEIVED ROUTE & SERVICE CHANGES MAY 2024

Comments received through email, social media and at GTC on evening and Saturday service hours:

- I work on Sat. If you change the hours it means I will need to have to leave work earlier then I do. That's not fair.
- Please have buses running at least an hour later than now.
- Really, really hope Saturday service hours will not be made permanent.
- Do not reduce Paratransit hours! My name is Jillian, and I moved to the Fargo Moorhead area a month ago. I am a Paratransit Rider. I tried to schedule a ride to be there tonight, but there were no times available. While I have not had a lot of experience using Paratransit since I moved here yet, I believe reducing hours would be doing a disservice to Riders and the community. It will affect our ability to work, spend time with friends and family and just be in the community. As I gain familiarity with Fargo Moorhead, I am excited to explore new places and meet new people. Trying to schedule some of my rides already three or four days in advance can be a difficult process. I want to have the option of going to later movies, socializing and doing parts of my job in the community later if I want to. The article in the Fargo Inforum states that the hours would be reduced to 6:15 a.m. to 10:15 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 7:15 a.m. to 8:15 p.m. Saturdays. For Paratransit users that actually would add another half an hour to 45 minutes reduction due to the current scheduling method. That would mean I can only be in the community between 6:45 a.m. and 9:45 p.m. Monday through Friday and 7:45 a.m. and 7:45 p.m. Saturdays. to me, that sends a message, that I, along with other paratransit riders, are not as welcome in the community as those who don't use MAT bus services, or those who do, but still have options of taxis, Uber, Lyft, or simply getting rides with other people.
- So MATBUS is extending your service to 10:15 p.m., instead of 9:15 p.m., while your ridership continues to decline?

Comments received through email, social media and at the GTC on Route cancellations and frequency reductions:

- NDSU Circulator Routes: No comments were received on elimination of Routes 32W and 36 or reducing frequency on Route 33.
- Do not change Route 15 from 15 min to 30 min. Already some of the drivers tend to be late and then have to skip that route time turning it into 30 min. People rely on every 15 min for route #15.
- Would Route 13 continue running every 30 minutes during the summer or would that change back running every 60 minutes. Response: This public hearing is just making portions of the current schedule permanent. Route 13 will continue with 30-minute weekday and 60-minute Saturdays year round.
- The proposed change would reduce Route 13 from 30-minute service to 60-minute service on Saturdays only.

Comments received through email, social media and at GTC unrelated to the Route and Service Changes Proposed:

- Add bus shall stop to Route 14 at Elliott Place, 4462 30th Ave S Fargo, instead of walking to bus stop and no shelter is very cold and wet.
- Don't reduce routes. Increase 14: to twice an hour. 11: to twice an hour.
- Although it wouldn't be hard to adjust to, I am a mature, responsible, sane, normal, smart person that worked all her life before she got disabled and maintained self care, I believe if we change it to 30 min bus rides on the 15 it will cause more entitlement, unsafe conditions for passengers and riders more violence yellin, etc. so please keep that in mind it is scary enough frankly with these losers that expect everything handed to them don't work and steal everything u own while getting everything handed to them & done for them while trashing our city getting dumber & dangerous and I who have worked since I was forced 2 quit due 2 injury at 31 & get disability gets everything stolen from her by him verbally & physically assaulted and not sitting(?) any help! Plz help!
- It's very easy for the disabled to get stranded in your city. 1. "Tree Lane Blowed(?)" by Landscape aka builders. 2. Calls for "help" when injured after could go unnoticed. 3. Hard time learning how to get (illegible).
- Lousy Transit System. Poor customer service. Inaccurate information on Routes. Buses don't show up. Too many missed connections. Dump Julie B. & get someone who cares.
- Would like Route #16 returned to Sat. I miss Route #16 on Saturdays. It's a very helpful route instead of Mhd Rt 1 & 3 or Rt. 24 to Cash Wise out there. Does Rt #18 go to Cash Wise in SW Fargo by Parkway? Please leave the other routes the way are. We all like those routes.
- The driver was nice & polite. Thank you! Jesus (heart) you!
- Can the HUB implement more security to mitigate exposure to drug consumption on premises? Alcohol bottles, needles, mem etc. paraphernalia. Thank you!
- One of my major concerns is that the buses need to leave the Marriott exactly on the dot. For example they need to leave at 12:30 p.m. not 12:27 p.m. This has led to a lot of people missing the bus because they go past the bus stops too early. This continues to be an issue.
- So keep screwing everyone. Gotcha.

Comments from Informational Meeting at GTC on May 6, 2024:

- You need to post paper public hearing notices inside the buses for those without computers.
- Return Routes 11/14 to 30-minute service all day.
- Return Route 16 service on Saturdays.
- I like that 11/14 are interlined, as this provides a one-seat ride to medical appointments.
- Moorhead hasn't cut service frequency from their routes and have reduced MSUM service.
- Reduce shuttle service to NDSU and allocate those drivers to the Fixed Routes to address the driver shortage. General public service should have the priority.
- Have you considered that the driver shortages is related to how the drivers are treated by First Transit and lack of good benefits? Find other alternatives or companies.
- Consider removing the Route 14 loop off of 32nd Avenue S.
- Return Route 13 frequency to 30-minutes.
- Add a few routes on Sundays. You have two buses on Paratransit on Sundays.
- Hire more dispatchers to cover after 7 p.m.
- Return Route 15 to 15-minute frequency.

- Do not reduce any morning service hours.
- Community events run later than the buses; need later service to Scheel's Arena, Red Hawks, Fargo Dome, LaCrosse games.
- Do not replace the fixed routes with on-demand Tapride, as not everyone has a computer or Smartphone.
- On-demand service to the industrial park and Amazon doesn't work well due to shirt work.
- For storm cancellations, need to update the website and the GTC phone message earlier (the day before).
- Shelters are not clean especially the one on 13th Ave. S. by Wendy's. Remove garbage more frequently.
- The times listed in the shelters have not been updated with the temporary suspensions. Passengers are not aware that routes are ending early.
- MATBUS needs to be dependable with their timetables and consistent service hours.

Responses to Comments from Informational Meeting at GTC on May 6, 2024:

- We will post notices of the public hearings in the bus this week to provide one-week notice to those without computers who haven't noticed the display at the GTC.
- Fargo does plan to return frequency to Routes 11/14, Route 16 Saturdays, Route 13 and Route 15 as drivers become available (by late August).
- NDSU purchases service from Fargo, similar to Dilworth purchasing from Moorhead and West Fargo purchasing from Fargo. NDSU does not own buses. NDSU has requested service reductions to some of the circulator routes, such as 32W and 33.
- It is more difficult to reduce frequency on Moorhead routes, due to interlining and connections at the Marriott hub.
- First Transit (or Transdev) has a contract for service through 2024 with a one-year option for 2025. Transdev is looking at ways to show more appreciation to employees through picnics.
 Wages were increased in 2024 and a pay differential was added for evening and weekend hours.
 More drivers are applying for jobs and we hope to have sufficient staff to reinstate some service in late-August.
- The Route 14 loop off of 32nd Avenue serves apartments and has good ridership; we would not reduce service to this area.
- MATBUS was moving towards implementing Sunday service before the COVID-19 Pandemic. However, ridership patterns and business openings have changed. Also, we would need to add staff to the garage, dispatch, driver supervision, etc., which is cost prohibitive at this time.
- In the 2025 budget request, Fargo has again asked for Dispatch staff to cover full operating hours.
- We have no plans to reduce morning hours.
- Regarding storm cancellation notices, MATBUS has signed up with WDAY and KVLY to post service cancellations online.
- MATBUS will monitor the shelter cleaning and look at frequency of garbage collection.
- MATBUS will change the times listed in shelters for temporary service changes that are expected to last longer than a brief detour.

Resolution to Approve Changes in Public Transit Service Hours for MATBUS and MAT Paratransit Effective July 1, 2024

WHEREAS, due to a continued driver shortage, public transit service enacted various temporary reductions in service hours to provide consistent and reliable service levels on MATBUS and MAT Paratransit, including evening hours between 10:15 p.m. to 11:15 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the COVID-19 pandemic, public transit has seen changing ridership patterns, as many businesses continue to close earlier in the evening, resulting in lower demand in the late evening; and

WHEREAS, a public informational meeting was held on May 6, 2024, to receive public input on proposed changes in service hours, whereby comments received were considered for the final recommendation to elected officials;

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on May 13, 2024, to receive public input on the final recommendations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Moorhead, contingent upon approval by the City of Fargo, that hereby approve reducing service hours on MATBUS and MAT Paratransit to end at 10:15 p.m. rather than 11:15 p.m., Monday through Saturday, effective July 1, 2024.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Moorhead that Transit administration may continue to temporarily suspend service on Saturdays from 8:15 p.m. to 10:15 p.m. until such time as sufficient drivers are available to reinstate these hours.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to hold a public hearing and consider, upon the unanimous recommendation of the Moorhead Economic Development Authority, and Moorhead Planning Commission related to land use, a resolution establishing the Downtown Moorhead Development Project; approving and accepting the Redevelopment Plan for Downtown Moorhead Development Project; and establishing Tax Increment Financing (Redevelopment) District No. 31 (Downtown Moorhead Development Project) and approving the Tax Increment Financing Plan therefor.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

Tax Increment Financing (TIF) is a tool to assist with financing eligible costs of a redevelopment with the incremental new taxes generated by a development so long as agreed upon development terms are met. Mikaela Huot, Baker Tilly, has provided a complete description of the TIF Plan and Redevelopment Project in the attached memo.

On May 6, 2024, the Moorhead Economic Development Authority (EDA) reviewed and recommended approval of a redevelopment plan for the Downtown Moorhead Development Project and Tax Increment Financing Plan for Tax Increment Financing District No. 31 (Downtown Moorhead Development Project).

On May 6, 2024, the Moorhead Planning Commission reviewed the Downtown Moorhead Development Project and Tax Increment Financing Plan for Tax Increment Financing District No. 31 (Downtown Moorhead Development Project) and found it to be consistent with the 2022 Comprehensive Plan as adopted by the City.

Executive Summary

The City of Moorhead is considering the establishment of a Tax Increment Financing District ("TIF District") and Redevelopment Project Area ("Project Area") to assist with financing a portion of the costs associated with redevelopment of the approximately 19.5 acres which will span nine city blocks. The new development will transform the current site of the Moorhead Center Mall, built in the 1960's, into a redeveloped downtown area providing year-round amenities for residents and visitors to work, live, relax, learn, and be entertained. By creating an area featuring mixed-use housing and retail, recreational facilities, restaurants, the arts, convenient parking, and more the site will re-establish key streets and strengthen the connection to the river. Growth in this area will provide tremendous tax benefits for the City of Moorhead, state of Minnesota and the community.

The property qualifies for inclusion within a redevelopment tax increment financing district with at least 50% of the buildings considered 'substandard' and at least 70% of the area within the proposed district 'occupied' by buildings, streets, sidewalks, parking lots, and similar structures, etc. The TIF Plan has been drafted utilizing assumptions relative to new development uses and anticipated construction timing. The budget of tax increment revenues and estimated public costs are based on anticipated new taxable value of \$269M upon completion of the entire site. Demolition and subsequent construction of the new development is projected to start in summer 2024 and continue construction through 2030. The redevelopment project is expected to be fully constructed by December 31, 2030, and be 100% assessed and on the tax rolls as of January 2, 2031, for taxes payable 2032. The City anticipates using tax increment revenues to finance eligible extraordinary costs associated with redevelopment of the project site including acquisition, site development and eligible redevelopment costs as well as related administrative expenses.

Process for TIF District Establishment

A Tax Increment Financing District is established within a Project Area and for this project proposal the boundaries of the TIF District and Project Area are coterminous. The City and EDA are considering the establishment of the new TIF District and Project Area to facilitate redevelopment of the existing substandard buildings and surrounding area that will include a new mixed-use development. A map showing the boundaries of the proposed Tax Increment Financing District No. 31 (Moorhead Downtown Development Project) and the Downtown Redevelopment Project Area are included in the draft document included with this memorandum.

The City and EDA are proposing to adopt the Redevelopment Plan for the Downtown Moorhead Redevelopment Project pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.001 to 469.049 and establish the Tax Increment Financing Plan for Tax Increment Financing (Redevelopment) District No. 31 (Downtown Moorhead Development Project) within the Redevelopment Project and adopt a Tax Increment Financing Plan relating thereto pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.174 to 469.1794. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 469.175, Subd. 3, the City needs to make certain findings that include the following:

- 1. The TIF District qualifies as a redevelopment district;
- 2. The proposed development, in the opinion of the City, would not reasonably be expected to occur solely through private investment within the reasonably foreseeable future;
- 3. The TIF Plan will afford maximum opportunity, consistent with the sound needs of the City as a whole, for development of the Project Area by private enterprise; and
- 4. The TIF Plan conforms to general plans for development of the City as a whole.

The City Council will hold a public hearing on Monday, May 13, 2024 to consider approval of the TIF District and Redevelopment Project Area, after making the findings outlined above. Multiple steps are followed to allow for establishment of a tax increment financing district and project area, including notifications to the County and School District, Planning Commission review and approval (as specific to establishment of project area), EDA review and approval, publication of a public hearing notice, and the holding of a public hearing. Notices have been sent to the County Commissioner on April 12 (with 30-day notice waiver received) and County and School Board (draft TIF Plan and fiscal and economic impacts) on Friday, April 12. EDA review and approval was 6 at 11:45am followed by the Planning Commission review later that same day on May 6. Publication of the hearing notice for the TIF District creation was Thursday, May 2 in The Fargo Moorhead Extra newspaper. The public hearing to consider this project is Monday, May 13, 2024. The public hearing date is the time in which City Council would take any public comment, and after the hearing, consider the adoption of a resolution approving the TIF District and Project Area.

Project Qualifications

To establish the area identified as a Redevelopment TIF District, the project as proposed will need to qualify for inclusion within a redevelopment TIF District. Redevelopment districts are a type of tax increment financing district in which one or more of the following conditions exists and is reasonably distributed throughout the district:

- (1) parcels comprising at least 70% of the area of the district are occupied by buildings, streets, utilities, paved or gravel parking lots, or other similar structures and more than 50% of the buildings, not including outbuildings, are structurally substandard requiring substantial renovation or clearance. A parcel is deemed "occupied" if at least 15% of the area of the parcel contains buildings, streets, utilities, paved or gravel parking lots, or other similar structures.
- (2) the property consists of vacant, unused, underused, inappropriately used, or infrequently used railyards, rail storage facilities, or excessive or vacated railroad right-of-ways; or
- (3) tank facilities, or property whose immediately previous use was for tank facilities, as defined in section 115C.02, subdivision 15, if the tank facilities:
 - (i) have or had a capacity of more than 1,000,000 gallons;
 - (ii) are located adjacent to rail facilities; and
 - (iii) have been removed or are unused, underused, inappropriately used, or infrequently used.

For districts consisting of two more noncontiguous areas, each area must individually qualify under the provisions listed above, as well as the entire area must also qualify as a whole. The TIF District qualifies as a redevelopment district in that it meets all of the criteria listed in (1) above. The supporting facts and documentation for this determination will be retained by the City and EDA for the life of the TIF District. An analysis was completed by Braun Intertec Corporation to make this determination.

Recommended Action Item

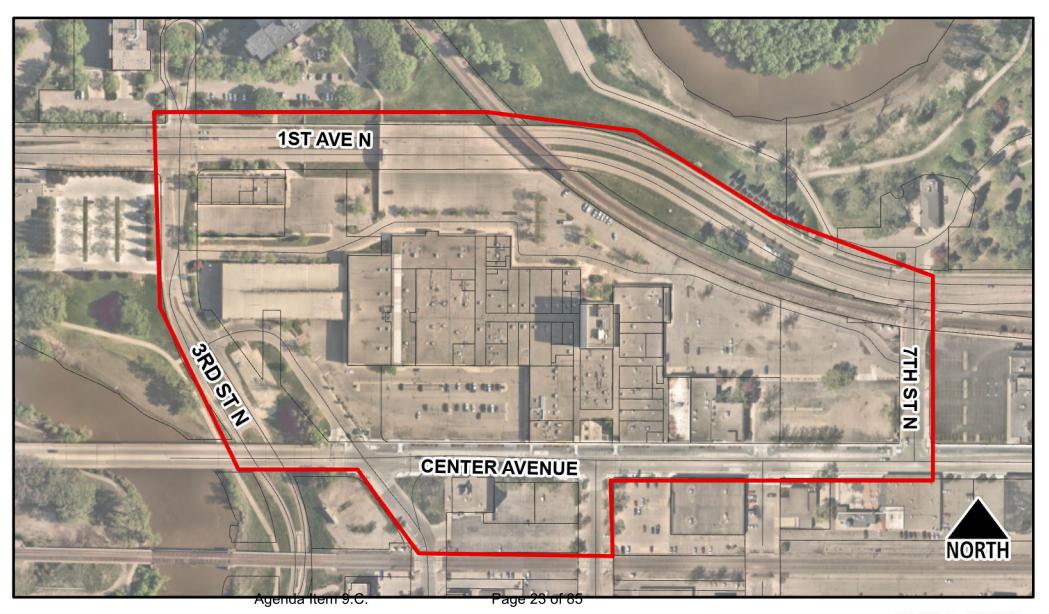

RESOLUTION

Resolution Establishing the Downtown Moorhead Development Project; Approving and Accepting the Redevelopment Plan for Downtown Moorhead Development Project; and Establishing Tax Increment Financing (Redevelopment) District No. 31 (Downtown Moorhead Development Project) and Approving the Tax Increment Financing Plan Therefor

WHEREAS, it has been proposed that the Moorhead Economic Development Authority (the "Authority") establish the area for the Downtown Moorhead Development Project (the "Redevelopment Project"); approve and accept the proposed Redevelopment Plan for Downtown Moorhead Development Project (the "Redevelopment Plan"), dated May 6, 2024; establish Tax Increment Financing (Redevelopment) District No. 31 (Downtown Moorhead Development Project) (the "TIF District") therein; and approve and accept the proposed Tax Increment Financing Plan for Tax Increment Financing (Redevelopment) District No. 31 (Downtown Moorhead Development Project), dated May 6, 2024, for the TIF District (the "TIF Plan"), all pursuant to and in conformity with applicable law, including Minnesota Statutes, Sections 469.001 through 469.047, Sections 469.048 through 469.068, and Sections 469.174 through 469.1794 (the "Act"), Laws of Minnesota 1986, Chapter 341 and the Home Rule Charter of the City of Moorhead, Minnesota (the "City"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority considered the establishment and adoption of the Redevelopment Project, Redevelopment Plan, the TIF District, and the TIF Plan at its meeting on May 6, 2024, and recommended the same to the City Council through the submission of an application; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission considered the Redevelopment Project, Redevelopment Plan, the TIF District, and the TIF Plan at its meeting on May 6, 2024, and found the Redevelopment Plan and the TIF Plan conform to the general plans for development and redevelopment of the City as a whole and recommended the same to the City Council for its approval; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Redevelopment Plan and the proposed TIF Plan (collectively, the "Plans") have been prepared and are presented for the City Council's consideration; and

WHEREAS, the City has performed all actions required by law to be performed prior to the establishment of the Redevelopment Project and the establishment of the TIF District therein, and the adoption of a proposed Redevelopment Plan and TIF Plan therefor, including, but not limited to, notification of Clay County and Independent School District No. 152 having taxing jurisdiction over the property to be included in the TIF District and the holding of a public hearing upon published and mailed noticed as required by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Moorhead as follows:

- 1. <u>Redevelopment Plan Findings</u>. The City finds, determines, and declares with respect to the Redevelopment Plan:
 - (a) The City hereby finds that the land in the Redevelopment Project would not be made available for redevelopment without the financial aid to be sought.
 - (b) The City further finds the Redevelopment Plan will afford maximum opportunity, consistent with the needs of the City as a whole, for the redevelopment of the Redevelopment Project and adjacent areas by private enterprise.

- (c) The City further finds the Redevelopment Plan conforms to the general plan for the development or redevelopment of the City as a whole.
- (d) The City further finds that the Redevelopment Plan is intended and, in the judgment of the City, its effect will be to promote the public purposes and to accomplish the objectives specified in the Redevelopment Plan for the Redevelopment Project.
- 2. <u>Redevelopment Project</u>. There is hereby established in the City of Moorhead the Redevelopment Project, the initial boundaries of which are fixed and determined as described in the Redevelopment Plan.
- 3. <u>Redevelopment Plan</u>. The proposed Redevelopment Plan for the Redevelopment Project is adopted as the redevelopment plan for the Redevelopment Project. A copy of the Redevelopment Plan will be on file in the office of the City Manager.
- 4. <u>TIF District</u>. There is hereby established in the City of Moorhead within the Redevelopment Project, the TIF District, the initial boundaries of which are fixed and determined as described in the TIF Plan.
- 5. <u>TIF Plan</u>. The TIF Plan is adopted as the TIF Plan for the TIF District, and the City Council makes the following findings:
 - (a) The TIF District is a redevelopment district as defined in Minnesota Statutes, Section 469.174, Subd. 10.
 - (b) In the opinion of the City, the proposed development would not reasonably be expected to occur through private investment within the reasonably foreseeable future. The reasons supporting this finding are:
 - The project area qualifies for inclusion within a redevelopment tax increment financing district with at least 50% of the buildings considered 'substandard' and at least 70% of the area within the proposed district 'occupied' by buildings, streets, sidewalks, parking lots, and similar structures, etc. The City anticipates using tax increment revenues to finance eligible extraordinary costs associated with redevelopment of the project site including acquisition, site development and eligible redevelopment costs as well as related administrative expenses. The City's finding is based on the analysis of the project pro forma and other materials submitted to the City by the developer and the findings of the Moorhead Economic Development Authority in the TIF Plan. These documents have indicated that the TIF District contains properties whose values are too low to pay for the public services required or rendered and properties whose lack of use or improper use has resulted in stagnant or unproductive land that could otherwise contribute to the public health, safety, and welfare. The City finds that the TIF District properties cannot be developed without public participation and assistance in various forms including property acquisition and/or write-down, proper planning, the financing of development costs associated with clearance, grading and soils correction, and the making of various other public and private improvements necessary for development. The developer has indicated in communications with the City and submitted financial data that the development as proposed would not move forward without tax increment assistance.
 - (c) The TIF Plan conforms to the general plan for development or redevelopment of the City as a whole. The reasons supporting this finding are:

- (i) The Planning Commission of the City has found the TIF Plan consistent with the general plan for development of the City as a whole and will generally complement and serve to implement policies adopted in the City's comprehensive plan.
- (d) The TIF Plan will afford maximum opportunity, consistent with the sound needs of the City as a whole, for the development or redevelopment of the Redevelopment Project area by private enterprise. The reasons supporting this finding are:
 - (i) Through the implementation of the TIF Plan, the City will provide an impetus for the construction of public improvements and other facilities on or for the benefit of said property, thereby promoting and securing the development of other land within the project area. By creating an area featuring mixed-use housing and retail (including rental and ownership opportunities for various income levels), recreational facilities, restaurants, the arts, convenient parking, and more the site will reestablish key streets and strengthen the connection to the river. Growth in this area will provide tremendous tax benefits for the City, State of Minnesota, and the community.
- 6. <u>Public Purpose</u>. The adoption of the Redevelopment Plan for the Redevelopment Project and the adoption of the TIF Plan for the TIF District therein conform in all respects to the requirements of the Act and will help fulfill a need for development within the City and the Redevelopment Project area in order to provide employment and housing opportunities, to improve the local tax base, and to improve the general economy of the City and the State.
- 7. <u>Certification</u>. The Auditor of Clay County is requested to certify the original net tax capacity of the TIF District as described in the TIF Plan and to certify in each year thereafter the amount by which the original net tax capacity has increased or decreased in accordance with the Act. The City Manager is authorized and directed forthwith to transmit this request to the County Auditor in such form and content as the County Auditor may specify, together with a list of all properties within the TIF District for which building permits have been issued during the eighteen (18) months immediately preceding the adoption of this Resolution.
- 8. <u>Filing</u>. The City Manager is further authorized and directed to file a copy of the Redevelopment Plan and TIF Plan for the TIF District with the Commissioner of Revenue and the Office of the State Auditor.
- 9. <u>Administration</u>. The administration of the Redevelopment Project is assigned to the City Manager who shall from time to time be granted such powers and duties as the City Council may deem appropriate.
- 10. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Resolution will be governed by, and construed and enforced in accordance with, the laws of the State of Minnesota.
- 11. <u>Electronic Signature</u>. The electronic signature of a party on this Resolution will be as valid as an original signature of such party and will be binding. For purposes hereof: (i) "electronic signature" means a manually signed original signature that is then transmitted by electronic means; and (ii) "transmitted by electronic means" means sent in a form of a facsimile or sent via the internet as a portable document format ("pdf") or other replicating image attached to an electronic mail or internet message.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to consider a resolution, upon the unanimous recommendation of the MCCARA Development Control Board, to construct a multi-phased project which includes a new office, shop, and warehouse building located at 4111 34 Ave S. (58.420.0040 – Tract 1-A) as consistent with the Industrial Standards and Protective Covenants of MCCARA Third Addition.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The MCCARA Development Control Board (DCB) met on April 24, 2024, to review the request of Vision Rentals, leasing to MinKo Construction, to construct a 18,220 square foot office and shop building, with unique architectural features. The building will include a lobby/reception area, conference room, workroom, breakroom, and offices. It will also have a large shop area, mezzanine, and warehouse. A future phase of the project includes another 9,000 square foot building.

A variance for the minimum building site coverage was approved to allow for phased construction and future expansion.

According to the recorded covenants, the City Council has the authority for final approval.

Sale of city-owned land was approved on November 27, 2023 (2023-1127-A) and the real estate closing will occur on or before June 1, 2024.

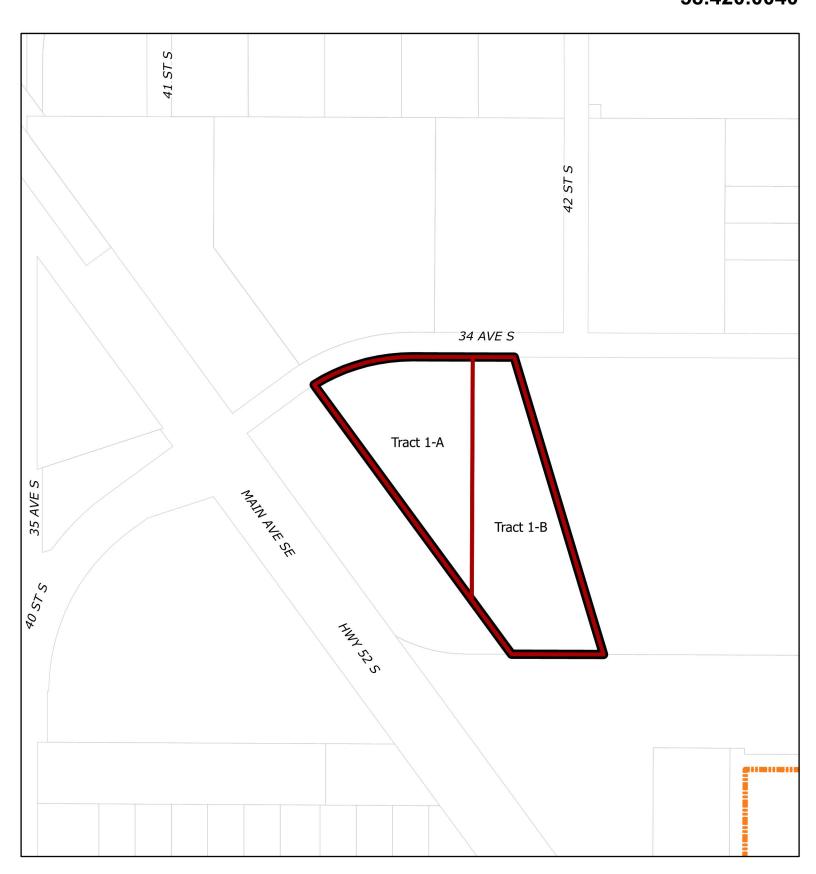

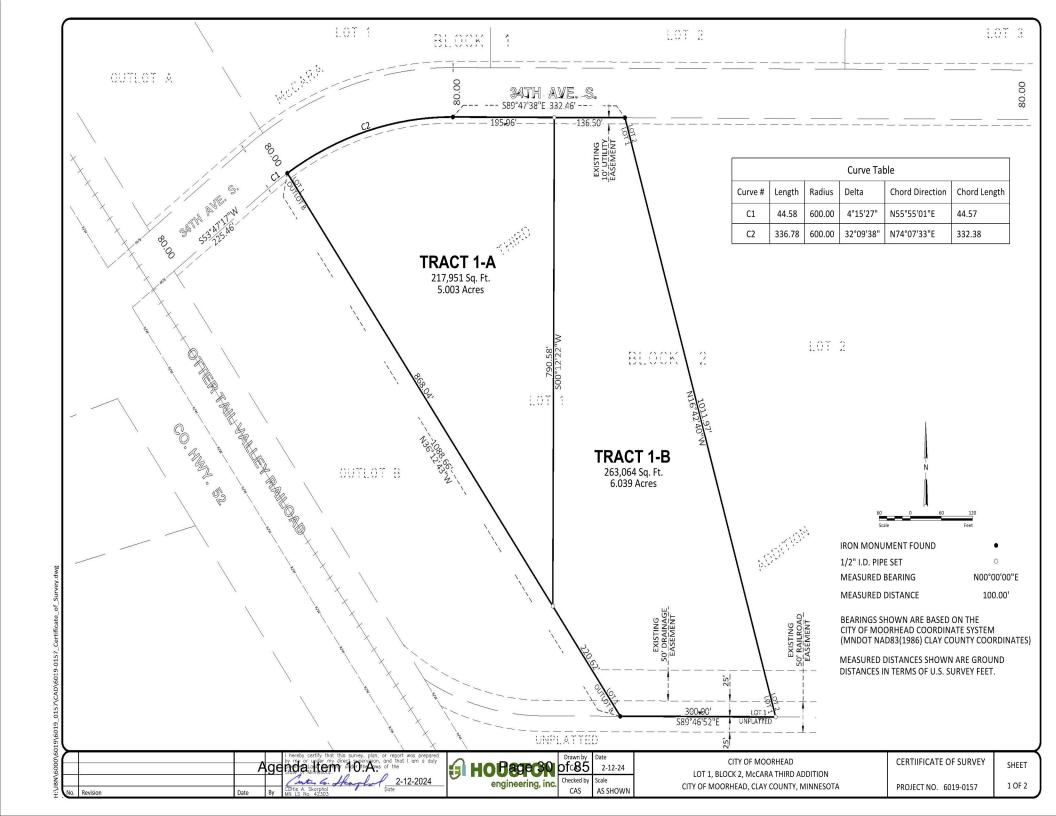
General Location Map

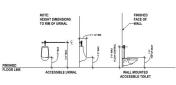

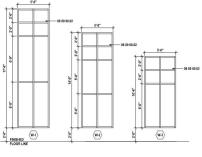

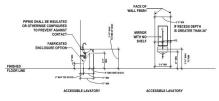

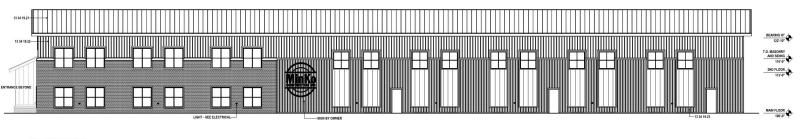
SECOND FLOOR PLAN

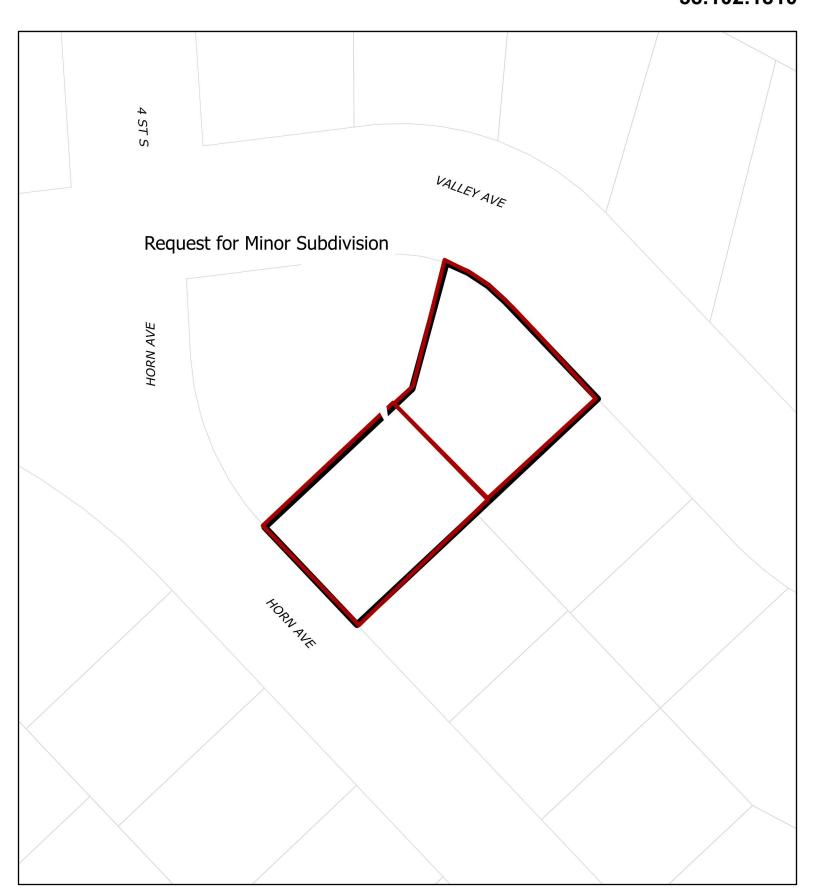

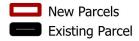

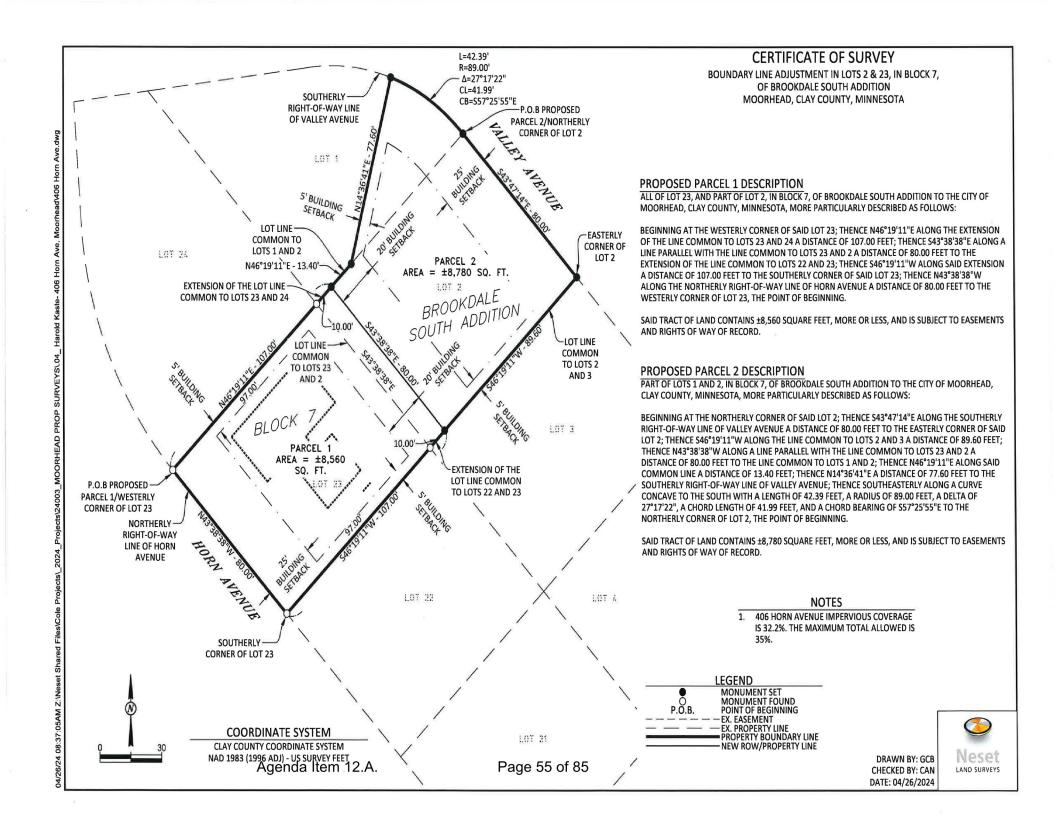

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The request is to facilitate a land sale of surplus City parcels to Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) Railroad. The completion of the 20th/21st Street Underpass along with a new wye track effectively eliminated the need for this section of 1st Avenue S. The remaining City-owned parcels along the affected portion of 1st Avenue S are landlocked between two railroad segments making redevelopment opportunities impractical. The sale of City-owned land to BNSF will relieve the City from maintaining these parcels and will provide opportunities for BNSF.

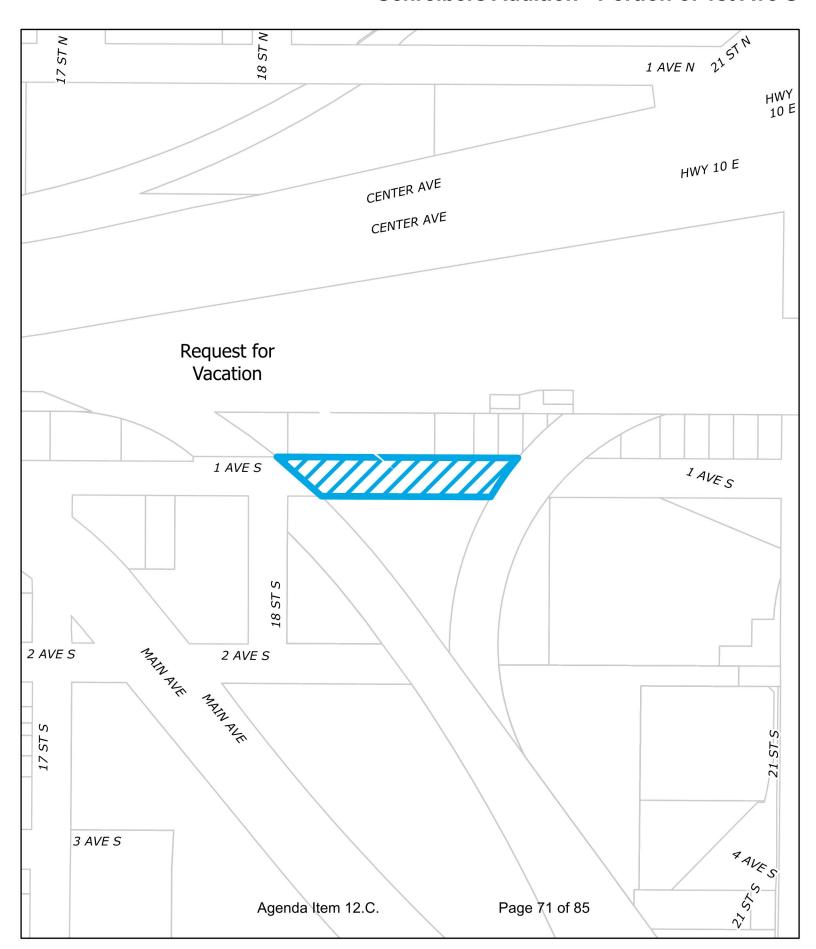

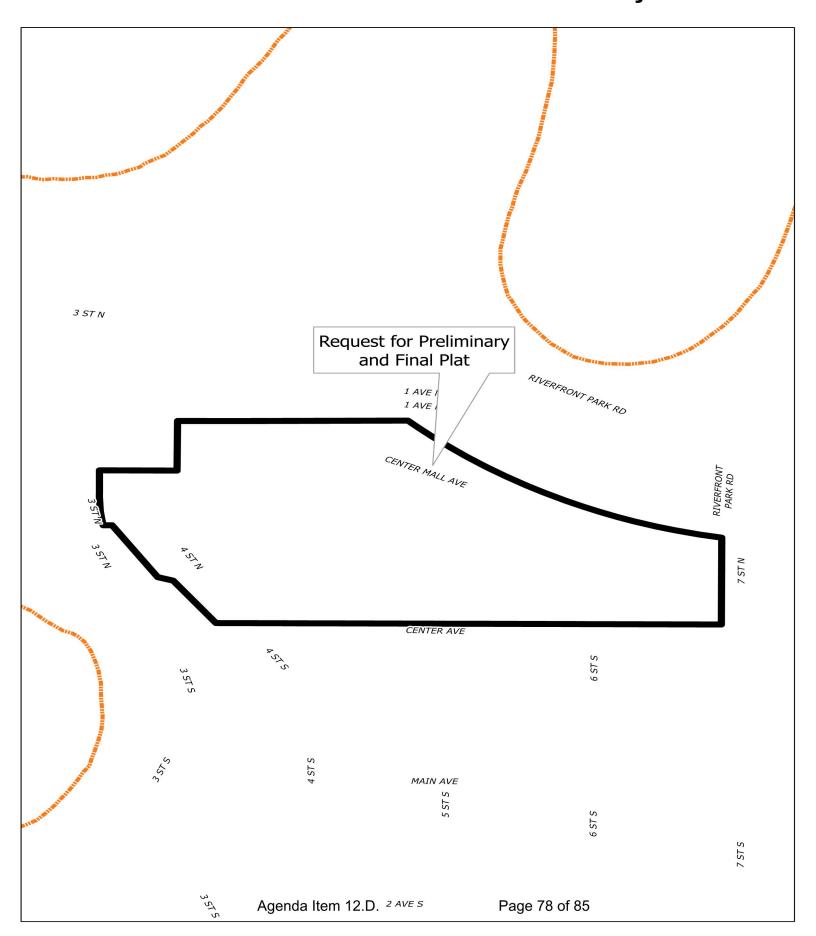

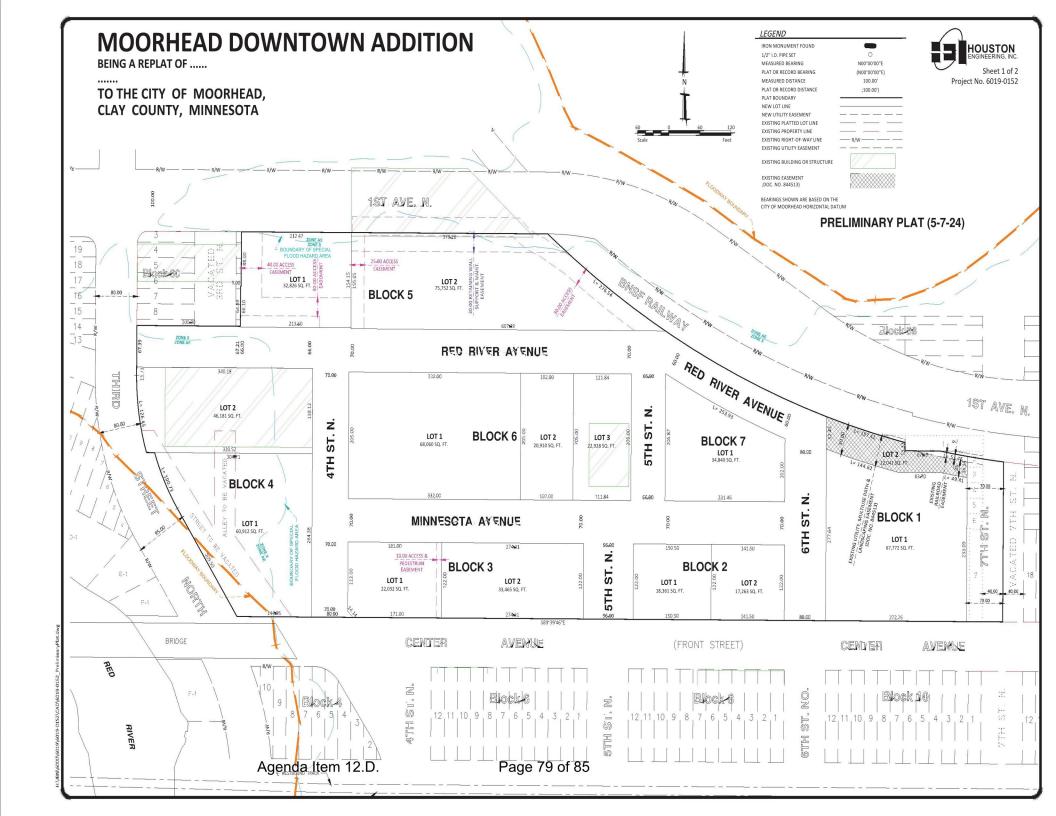

Resolution to Approve Budget Adjustment #24-014 Related to the Cost of Updating the Transit Development Plan

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to consider approval of Budget Adjustment #24-014 to provide local share match to the Fargo-Moorhead Metropolitan Council of Governments (Metro COG) to request proposals from consultants, to select a consultant and begin work on the five-year update to the Transit Development Plan (TDP).

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The 2021-2025 Transit Development Plan will expire at the end of 2025. The plan is a federal requirement and provides a five-year vision and guidance for the Fargo-Moorhead metro area transit system with an emphasis on future needs and sustainable growth. The Fargo-Moorhead Metropolitan Council of Governments (Metro COG) has notified us that grant funds are available to request proposals and begin working on the TDP in 2024 and complete the plan in 2025. A local match is needed to support this planning work.

The draft Request for Proposals (RFP) will be reviewed by the Metro COG Transportation Technical Committee and the Policy Board in May.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Metro COG has federal grant funds available and estimates the total cost for the project to be \$200,000. The grant funds will be spent \$100,000 in 2024 and \$100,000 in 2025. The 20% local match will be split one-third Moorhead and two-thirds Fargo per our standard cost-sharing formula. Moorhead's 2024 local match will be \$6,667 ($$100,000 \times 20\% = $20,000 \times 1/3 = $6,667$). Revenue is available from the Mass Transit Reserve Fund or potentially from Transit's Federal CARES Act grant (pending FTA consideration).
