Public Hearing Regarding the Request of Kevin Bartram on behalf of RFI2, LLC for a Renaissance Zone Property Tax Exemption for a Multi-family Residential Redevelopment Project located at the corner of 14th Street and Main Ave (58.847.0320; 58.847.0330; 58.847.0350)

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to conduct a Public Hearing and consider, upon the unanimous recommendation of the Moorhead Economic Development Authority, approval of a Renaissance Zone property tax exemption for RFI2, LLC to construct a multi-family residential redevelopment project located at the corner of 14th Street and Main Ave.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The Moorhead City Council and Moorhead Economic Development Authority find that granting property tax exemptions pursuant to program requirements set forth in policies approved on September 12, 2011, increases the community's long-term economic vitality through the creation of additional housing choice, new jobs, increasing employment opportunities for Moorhead residents and expanding Moorhead's property tax base. Further, that existing business will benefit by increasing total number of businesses in Moorhead, thereby positioning Moorhead as a destination to more customers.

Renaissance Zone: Moorhead's Renaissance Zone (RZ) is a zone targeting urban development, infill, and redevelopment of commercial or residential properties within the zone to concentrate reinvestment in Moorhead's downtown, near downtown, and transitional areas. Both commercial and multi-family residential may qualify for a 100% exemption. The City of Moorhead offer extended property tax exemption terms for this area as an added incentive to spur development within the zone. The project is in the downtown area of the RZ. There is no minimum job goal within the RZ.

Project: RFI2, LLC represented by Kevin Bartram, has plans to redevelop a former gas station site which has been vacant since at least 2008 with known contamination issues by demolishing the structure, removing any remaining underground tanks (if any), and cleaning up any leak sites related to the petroleum tanks. He will also demolish two residential structures (an adjacent house and a garage/apartment) to construct a new 28-unit, walkup style apartment building fronting Main Avenue which includes a mix of 1, 2, and 3-bedroom units. It is anticipated that residents would be a mix of college students, young professionals, and others interested in living downtown. The project also includes 18 garage parking stalls and 25 off-street parking spaces behind the apartment building.

The project compliments existing businesses, the surrounding neighborhood, and the downtown in general. It is thoughtfully designed to add a mix of unit types and sizes, all of which open to public streets and encourage neighborhood interactions. Materials are carefully selected to blend with the neighborhood to create a more residential scale.



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Goals & Objectives: The Renaissance Zone Policy requires the applicant to outline how their project will meet or exceed the City's Renaissance Zone goals and objectives. Here are the highlights:

- ✓ Activity Generators High quality housing will generate more activity for all nearby businesses.
- ✓ Walkable Districts The project is within walking distance to grocery store, pharmacy, banks, universities, churches, eateries, coffee shops, bars, shopping, and park facilities.
- ✓ Transportation The project includes garages and off-street parking for its tenants behind the apartment building. The building faces Main Ave with walk-up units that generate activity at the street level. Public transportation is very accessible at this site.
- ✓ Infill The project reduces blight by demolishing a vacant gas station and adjacent structures and constructing a new 28-unit multi-family apartment building using existing infrastructure within walking distance to many downtown services and amenities.
- ✓ More objectives are included in the attached application.

Exemption Term: The term of the exemption is based on the developer's capital investment per square foot. To calculate "per square foot" values, the investment number is divided by the total square footage of the entire building, excluding the basement (if any) and all nonworking or non-living areas. Capital investment costs are defined as "demolition, repair, replacement, or renovation of a building's exterior, roof, structural systems, electrical/plumbing, heating/ventilation/air condition systems, windows, exterior doors, elevator improvements, and accessibility improvements. In addition, capital costs include soft costs including architecture and construction management fees."

Cost per Square Foot Calculation

New Construction

 $$5,000,000 \cos t / 24,440 sf = ~$205 \cos t / sf$

Based on the above criteria and the projections found within the application, this project is eligible for a 15-year exemption period. The exemption breakdown is for a period of fifteen years at 100% exemption for the first five-years, 75% exemption for years six through ten, and 50% exemption for years eleven through fifteen. Please see the attached application for more details.

Timeline: Construction of the project, if approved, will begin in Summer 2025 with an anticipated completion Summer of 2026. Whatever construction is completed in 2025 will be assessed January 2, 2026, and become payable in 2027. Therefore, the first year of the proposed exemption would be 2027. In the event that construction is only partially complete on January 2, 2026, the project operator may choose to pay taxes for the partial year and begin the full exemption in 2028.

Zoning: The parcel is located within the "MU-3 Commercial Mixed Use" zoning district. The proposed use is permitted within the zoning district. The final building plans will meet all the requirements of the MU-3 zoning district.

City Code states that "The purpose of the MU-3 district is to create a flexible approach to land use that enhances residential and commercial development by encouraging a balance of mixed land uses that provide unique places for people to live, work and shop. The MU-3 district encourages a variety of uses aimed at providing a diversity of jobs, residential opportunities, entertainment venues, and concentrated commercial services and shopping facilities. The district encourages a scale of development and mixture of uses that promotes safe and efficient movements for pedestrians, bicyclists, transit users and motor vehicles while maintaining the character and integrity of adjacent residential neighborhoods." (Ord. 2012-2, 2-27-2012)

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

A property tax exemption is forgone tax revenue for a period of time. The maximum benefit to the applicant for this redevelopment project is estimated at approximately \$532,962 in property tax exemptions using an estimated new assessed building value (\$2,960,000) and current tax rate (1.6%) for a period of fifteen (15) years (5 years at 100%, 5 years at 75%, 5 years at 50%).

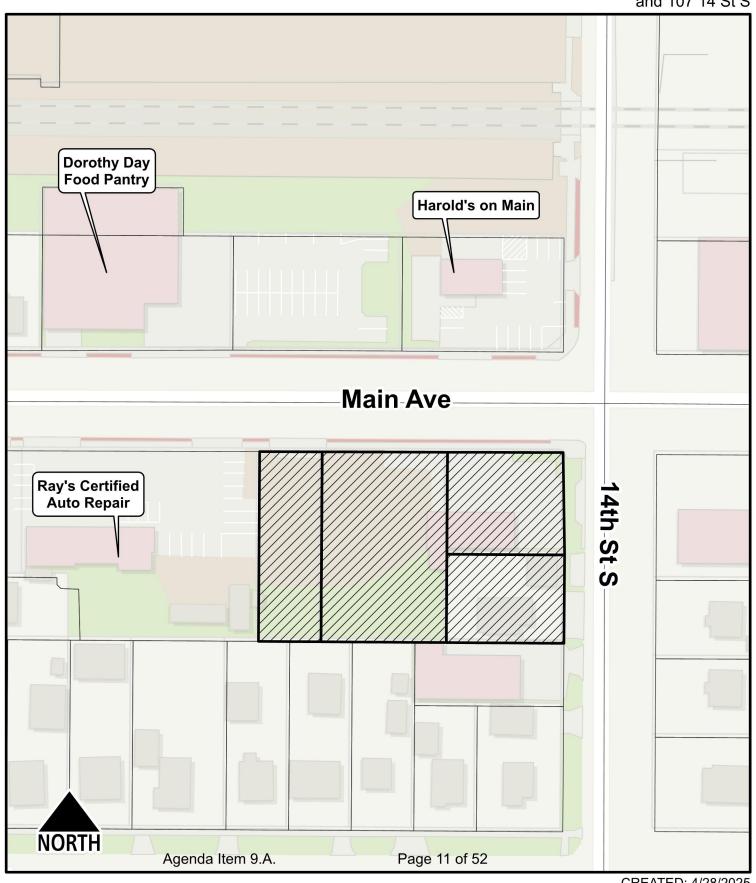

Investment Thresholds:

Requesting a 15 year exemption based on an estimated new project cost of \$5,000,000 ÷ 24,440 SF = \$205 / SF (exceeds minimum requirement of \$200 / SF).

Tenant Mix – 28 market rate apartments including a mix of 1, 2, and 3 bedroom apartment units. It is anticipated that there will be a mixture of college students, millennials, and other age groups interested in living in downtown Moorhead.

Construction to begin in Summer 2025 with anticipated completion Summer of 2026.

10. How Project Enhances Renaissance Zone Goals & Objectives

- **Activity Generator** New apartments will bring people to the area and will generate more activity for all nearby businesses.
- **Walkable Districts** This building is within walking distance to a grocery store, pharmacy, banks, universities, churches, eateries, bars, shopping, apartments, and park facilities.
- Ground Floor Uses The first floor is apartment units that will include fenced, ongrade patios for security that also will provide space for residents to interact with neighbors and passerbys.
- **Neighborhood Center** The pedestrian friendly design is an excellent addition to other buildings already located in Moorhead's "Center." This is a facility that will be an excellent addition to an existing mixed-use neighborhood.
- Urban Design The proposed project will add new walk-up type apartment units to engage the street. The apartments will be constructed on a site that is vacant and in a blighted condition.
- Transportation The project includes garages and off-street parking for its tenants behind the apartment building. The apartment building is next to Main Avenue and has walk-up units that will generate activity at the street level. Public transportation is very accessible at this site.
- Safe Streets-Safe Neighborhoods The project includes street level apartments
 with fenced patios and balconies fronting the street. Increased activity will improve
 safety.
- High Quality Housing Includes 28 market rate apartments of varying sizes and price points. Unique plan with walk-up apartments with off-street parking and detached garages.
- Infill The current site includes a vacant gas station and a single family residence.
 The new project includes 28 apartment units and parking. The streets and infrastructure around the site are existing.

- Housing Amenities The amenities include off-street parking and garages, patios/balconies facing the street, walk-up apartment units with 6 to 8 units accessed by each stair/entrance, and internal amenities such as washers and dryers in each unit.
- Downtown Entryways This project site is located on Main Avenue which is a major traffic corridor to downtown.
- The Place to Be The new housing will be near the heart of Downtown Moorhead and near a grocery store, pharmacy, Universities, retail, dining, and other downtown businesses
- 24 Hours/Day, 7 Days/Week, 365 Days This project will increase the density in the downtown area which will support existing and new businesses in the area.
- Connections and Coordination The project is designed to enhance the area with walk-up apartments along Main Avenue with off-street and garage parking behind. This building has a pedestrian scale and 3-story design that respects the adjacent residential area.

Resolution to Approve a Renaissance Zone Property Tax Exemption for RFI2, LLC, to Construct a Multi-family Residential Redevelopment Project located at the corner of 14th Street and Main Ave (58.847.0320; 58.847.0330; 58.847.0340; 58.847.0350)

WHEREAS, RFI2, LLC, Project Operator, desires to construct a new multi-family housing redevelopment project on the southwest corner of Main Ave and 14th Street S consisting of a new 28-unit, walk-up style apartment building fronting Main Avenue. Tenant parking includes 18 garages and 25 off-street parking spaces behind the apartment; and

WHEREAS, the redevelopment site, a former gas station built in 1956 and last known as Orton's Main 76, had been closed since at least 2008, vacant, and in decline since at least that time. The site continues to have known contamination related to the petroleum tanks which the Project Operator will remove and/or clean up at their expense; and

WHEREAS, the Project meets the following criteria used to review a Renaissance Zone application: multi-family residential project which will enhance pedestrian connectivity with the neighborhood and contributes to street level activation; and

WHEREAS, the City of Moorhead, pursuant to Minnesota Statute Chapter 469.1732, Subdivision 1, has authority to grant a partial or complete exemption from property taxation of all buildings, structures, fixtures, and improvements used in or necessary to a qualifying business; and

WHEREAS, the City of Moorhead has received a completed application form filed in accordance with applicable City procedures, policy, and guidelines from Kevin Bartram on behalf RFI2, LLC requesting the following tax incentives: exemption from property taxation; and

WHEREAS, the application form filed with the City and all associated documentation are complete and have been reviewed and evaluated by City staff; and

WHEREAS, proper notice to competitors pursuant to Minnesota Statute Chapter 469.1734, Subdivision 7, was published twice in the City's official newspaper on May 1, 2025, and May 8, 2025, respectively; and

WHEREAS, RFI2, LLC is a qualifying business as defined in Minnesota Statute 469.1734; and

WHEREAS, granting the requested tax incentive is in the best interest of the City of Moorhead to enhance the property tax base and create new jobs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Moorhead that:

- 1. The City Council of the City of Moorhead hereby finds that granting an exemption from property taxation to RFI2, LLC is necessary to enable RFI2, LLC to expand services in the City of Moorhead and is in the best interest of the City of Moorhead.
- 2. The City Council of the City of Moorhead hereby grants the tax incentives contained here subject to the terms and conditions in this resolution, the corresponding Tax Incentive Agreement, and the Laws of Minnesota.

3. The City of Moorhead hereby approves the application and grants Sterling Development Group Four LLC an exemption from property taxation of new building value according to the following schedule:

New Construction Cost / square foot	Exemption Term	Exemption Percentage
\$100 / sq ft	5 years	Years 1 – 5: 100%
\$150 / sq ft	10 years	Years 1 – 5: 100% Years 6 – 10: 75%
\$200 / sq ft	15 years	Years 1 – 5: 100% Years 6 – 10: 75% Years 6 – 10: 50%

After the project is complete, RFI2, LLC is responsible for providing the City a financial report with enough detail to document costs and capital investments in the project to be utilized by the City to determine the final minimum investment threshold and exemption term.

4. The Mayor and City Manager are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Tax Incentive Agreement on file by and between the City of Moorhead and RFI2, LLC.

The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to certify this grant of exemption from property taxation to the City Assessor and County Assessor contingent upon RFI2, LLC and the City executing the Tax Incentive Agreement.

Resolution to Award Bid for the Reconstruction of 34th St N from 4th Ave S to 3rd Ave N. Eng. No. 23-02-01

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and City Council are asked to consider a resolution to award the bid to Border States Paving of Fargo, ND in the amount to \$6,488,204.26 for the reconstruction of 34th St from 4th Ave S to 3rd Ave N (Eng. No. 23-02-01).

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

The proposed project area includes 34th St from 4th Ave S to 3rd Ave N and is included in the in the City's 2025-2029 Capital Improvement Plan for construction in 2025. The road is functionally classified as a minor arterial and is included in the City's Municipal State Aid (MSA) street system. The north half of this segment of road (TH 10 to 3rd Ave N) straddles the City limits separating Moorhead and the City of Dilworth. In accordance with the 34th St Improvement Agreement dated September 1, 2019 between Moorhead and Dilworth, the two cities will equally share the cost of that portion of the work. Because this road is a minor arterial / MSA street, the road is eligible for partial Federal and State funding. Moorhead and Dilworth jointly applied for and were awarded partial Federal and State funding for this project.

Key components of the project include:

- 1. The existing bituminous pavement will be replaced with concrete pavement
- 2. The temporary traffic signal at 4th Ave S will be replaced with a permanent signal
- 3. The bridge approach panels that have settled will be replaced
- 4. Several driveways north of Highway 10 will be modified to enhance safety
- 5. A sidewalk will be added to the east side between Highway 10 and 3rd Ave N
- 6. Construction includes 7 phases in order to keep the segment north of Highway 10 open to traffic at all times (some businesses only have access from 34th St and MATBus operates 4 bus routes on this segment)

The City received bids on Thursday, May 15, 2025. Since the project has been authorized for partial Federal and State funding, the apparent low bidder is required to submit information regarding their proposal to MnDOT for review and approval before the City can award the bid. It is anticipated that it will take about two weeks for this review to be completed. To expedite the project, staff recommends that the Council award the bid contingent upon receipt of formal approval from MnDOT to award the bid.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Three bids for the project were received on May 15, 2025. The bids are detailed in the attached bid tabulation and summarized below:

The low bid received is approximately 32%, or approximately \$1,585,000 over the Engineer's Estimate. Upon review of the estimate, the additional cost is largely due to the complex nature of the phasing of project construction that was necessary to maintain traffic on 34th St. Nearly 90% of the additional cost can be attributed to 12 bid items related to mobilization, traffic control, removals and concrete sidewalk, and curb & gutter installation. These items all become less efficient to construct due to the need to maintain traffic, and the estimate did not accurately capture that complexity. Staff from both Moorhead and Dilworth have discussed the bids and recommend that the bid be awarded to the low bidder. The bids were competitive and rebidding the project is not expected to provide more favorable bids.

The total cost of the improvements, including contingencies, engineering, administrative and legal fees, is approximately \$7,292,950. The cities have been authorized to receive approximately \$3,767,000 in Federal funds and \$1,500,000 in State funds for this project. The City of Dilworth will reimburse Moorhead \$463,420 for its share of the project cost. The remaining City of Moorhead share of \$1,562,530 will be paid using MSA street funds.

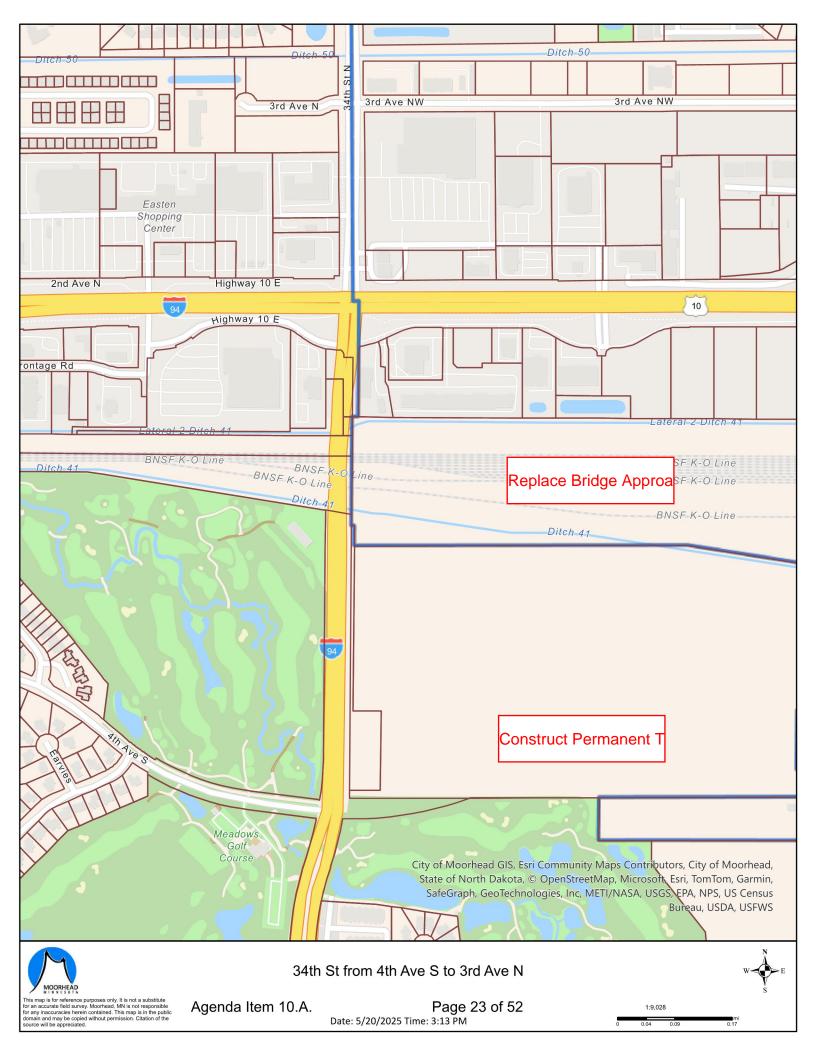

It is found, determined and declared that the lowest responsive, responsible bid with respect to the proposed improvement was received from Border States Paving, Inc. of Fargo, North Dakota in the amount of \$6,488,204.26. Said bid is in all respects in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore approved by the City Council. Thus, said bid is hereby in all things approved and accepted.
- 2. The City of Moorhead and the City of Dilworth are jointly constructing this project pursuant to the 34th Street Improvement Agreement dated September 1, 2019, with the City of Moorhead acting as the lead agency, and the City of Moorhead share of the project cost financed through a combination of Municipal State Aid and Federal Aid funds.

Second Reading of Ordinance 2025-06: An Ordinance Amending the Official Zoning Map Rezoning Parcels within Mixed Use Zoning Districts and Parcels with Mixed Use Future Land Use Designation, and Amending and Reenacting Title 10, Chapter 18, Use Regulations

RECOMMENDATION:

The Mayor and Council are asked to consider a Second Reading of Ordinance 2025-06: An Ordinance Amending the Official Zoning Map Rezoning Parcels within Mixed Use Zoning Districts and Parcels with Mixed Use Future Land Use Designation, and Amending and Reenacting Title 10, Chapter 18, Use Regulations.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

During the 2022 Onward Moorhead Comprehensive Plan update, updated future land uses were approved throughout the city to reimagine development and redevelopment for the next 10 years. In order to implement those updates, we are now evaluating all 13,000+ city parcels and make complimentary zoning map changes. In April, City Council approved city-wide changes to commercial parcels.

This group of map amendments focuses on mixed use zoning districts and parcels with mixed use future land use designations, evaluating 618 parcels as follows:

- 129 parcels required zoning updates.
- 41 single-family dwellings were made non-conforming uses in MU-3. These dwellings are located within one block of 1st Ave N or Main Ave where new single-family dwellings are no longer permitted. However, these structures may continue to be used as single-family dwellings or now have the option of adding units or mixed uses, which would make them conforming uses in MU-3.
- 1 commercial use (former storage/current party/game rental) was made a non-conforming use in MU-2. However, this 1970 structure was set to be demolished for a new self-storage development when it was rezoned to commercial in 2022. The new MU-2 zone offers more redevelopment flexibility for housing and neighborhood-friendly commercial uses.
- 11 previously non-conforming multi-family and commercial uses were made conforming uses.

In addition to the proposed zoning map amendments, staff continues to clean up Title 10, Zoning. Chapter 18, Use Regulations required a few minor changes to the use table and provisional use language as follows:

Proposed change 1: Add twin homes and duplexes as permitted uses in the 10-18-1. Use Table for MU-3: Commercial Mixed Use. This change was always planned for these areas but was missed in previous updates. See attached use table.

Proposed change 2: Add State-licensed cannabis microbusinesses and mezzobusinesses as provisional uses GG. and HH. in 10-18-1. Use Table for MU-2: Neighborhood Mixed Use. This

was the intent and it is stated in the 10-18-2. GG. and HH. Provisional Use text to permit retail sales only but was missed being added in the previous update (all other retail-only operations are permitted in MU-2). See attached use table.

Proposed change 3: Clarify 10-18-2. State-licensed cannabis microbusinesses and mezzobusinesses GG. and HH. Provisional Use text by removing language referencing "outdoor smoking and vaping" as this use is contrary to statute and clarify other language. See attached draft ordinance.

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on May 5, 2025 and unanimously recommended approval of the mixed use map amendments with no public comment. The complete Planning Commission packet can be found at: City of Moorhead : Planning Commission

The Council approved a first reading of the Ordinance on May 12, 2025.

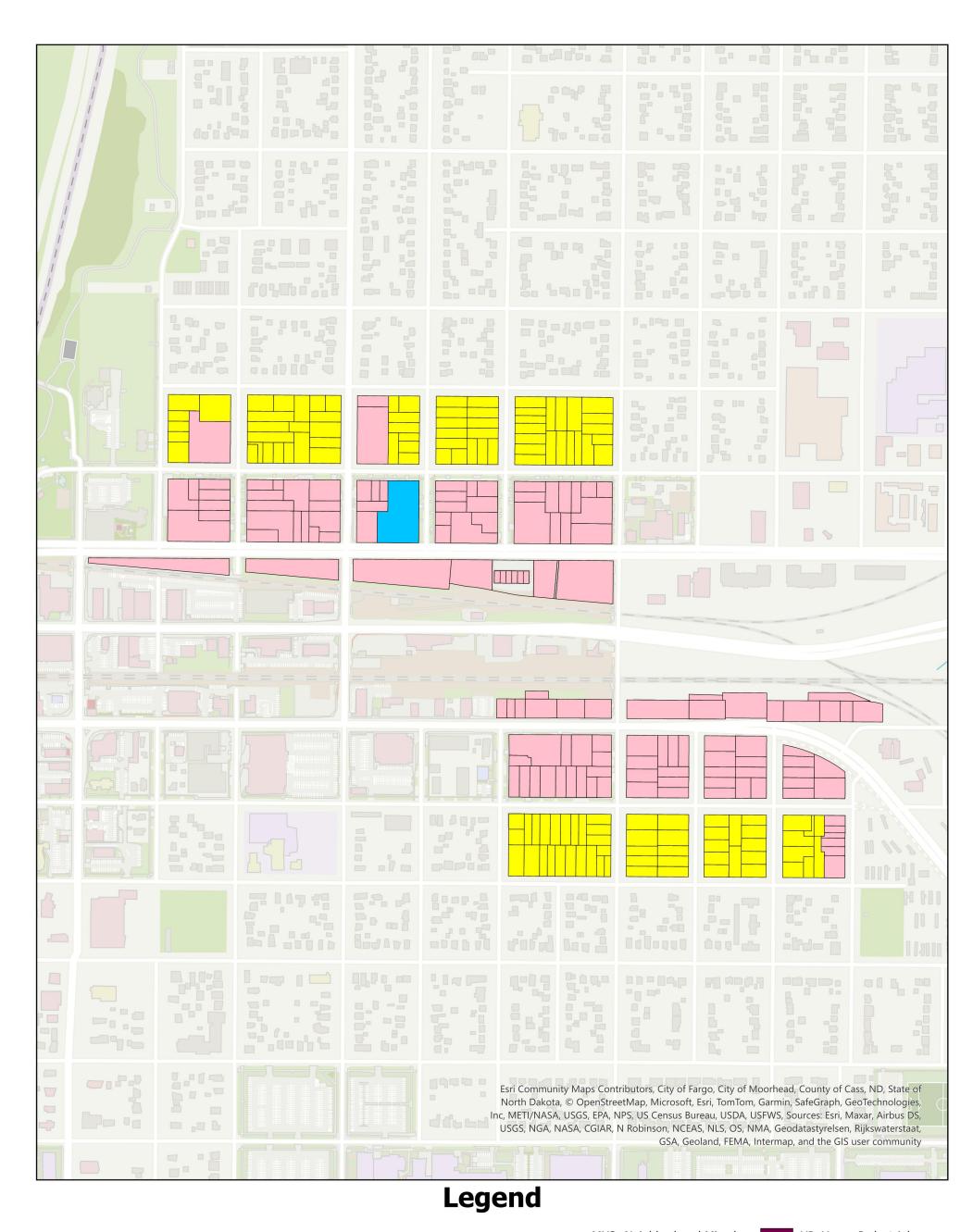

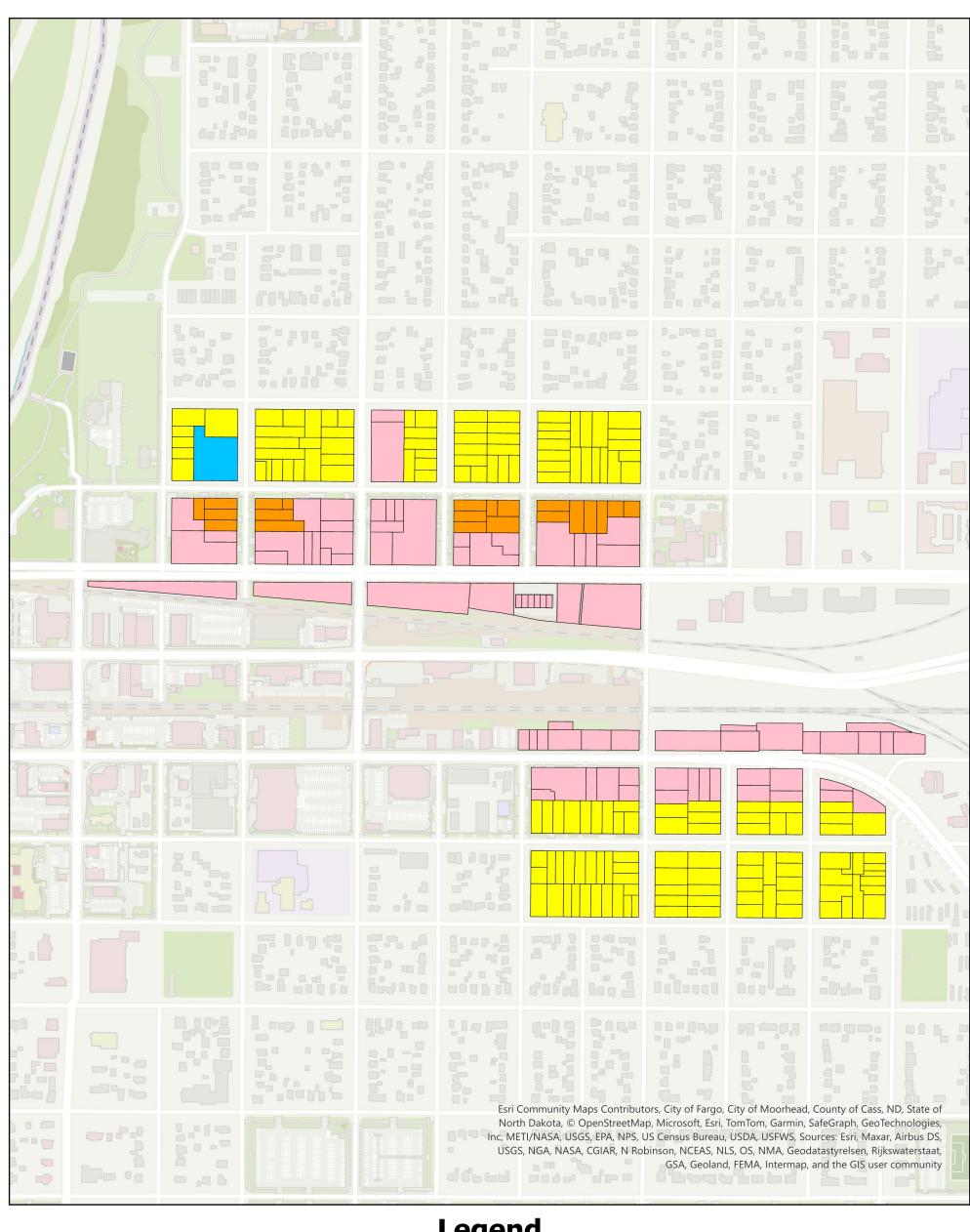

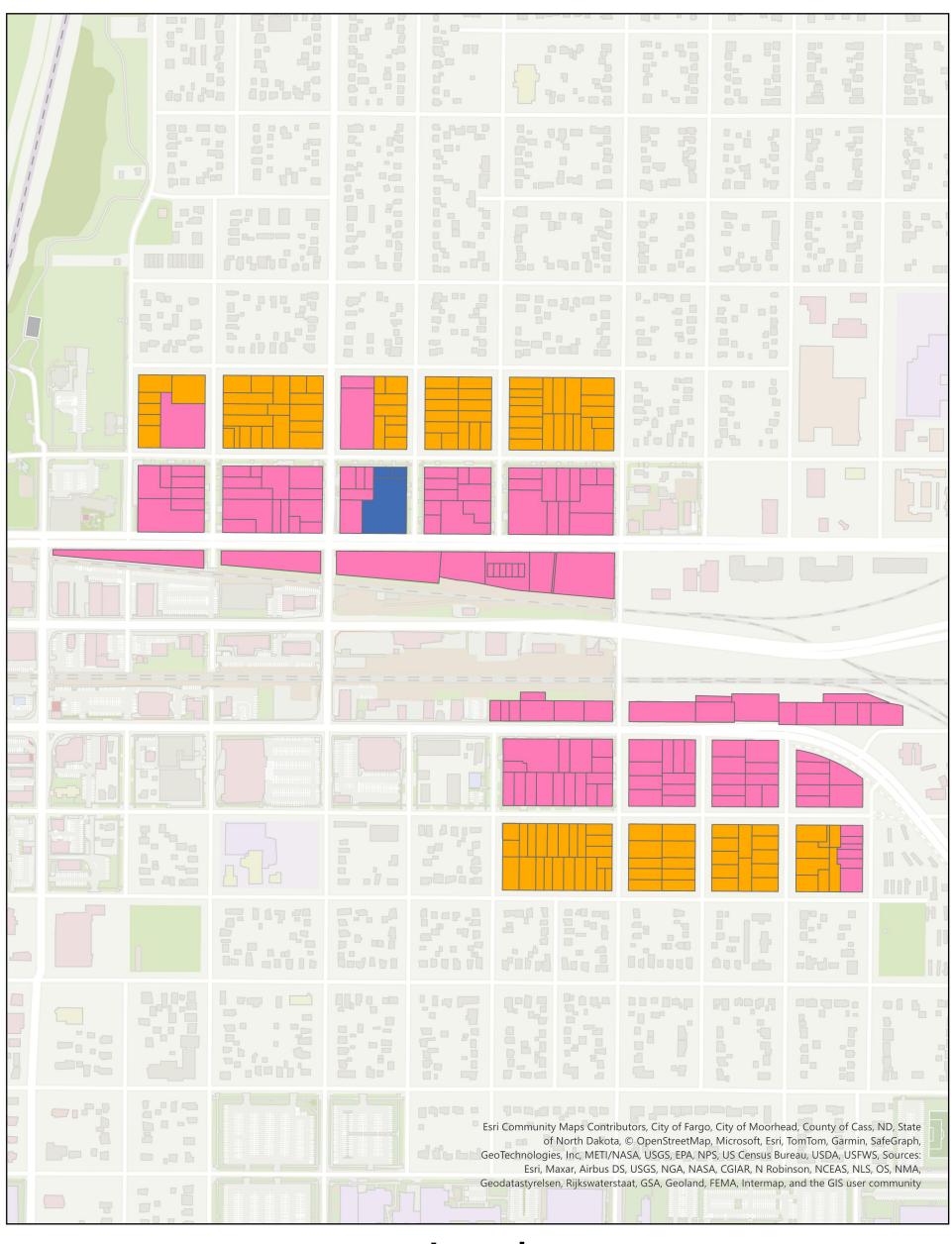

Resolution to Award Bid for Roof Replacement at 415 Highway 75 North

RECOMMENDATION:

The Moorhead Public Service Commission respectfully requests the Mayor and City Council award the bid for replacing the roof at Moorhead Public Service's storage building located at 415 Highway 75 North in Moorhead to Gateway Building Systems, Inc, in the amount of \$164,200.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

On October 19, 2021, the Commission approved Task Order No. 2020-2 with Sandman Structural Engineers (SSE) for engineering services related to replacing and reinsulating the metal roof and metal walls, as well as developing a conceptual design for a portion of the building to be used as a business office, if necessary. Since 2017, SSE has assisted with other task orders to assist Moorhead Public Service (MPS) staff with facility planning and maintenance, as well as additional structural needs.

SSE prepared specifications for replacing the roof at MPS' storage building. Construction will include installing new metal roofing over the existing roofing panels, new fascia, soffits, and gutters. On May 8, 2025, MPS received six qualified bids. The lowest, qualified bidder is Gateway Building Systems, Inc., in the amount of \$164,200. The bid amount is approximately 45 percent less than the engineer's estimate of \$300,000. Attached is SSE's recommendation letter and Bid Tabulation. Construction is expected to be substantially completed on or before October 31, 2025.
